In the Folkers/Dappen Sunday School class we were discussing Moses and how this one ordinary man set into motion a dramatic sequence of events for the Israelite people. God chose Moses to be the one to lead his people away from Egypt's enslavement so that they might enjoy the same kind of freedoms that their enslavers enjoyed. The Moses story is still relevant to our world today.

Judy Slavik and I witnessed another story of how one person got the nudge to begin work in a small food pantry which started over 25 years ago. We helped celebrate Barbara Greshem's 25 years of service in the Living Hope Pantry. It set into motion a ripple effect that encouraged and urged other churches to contribute to this food and clothing pantry. Many thanks to Trinity members who donated food for the Thanksgiving meals. A carload of food was taken as well as a \$200 gift card to buy turkeys.

Although we didn't get as many Christmas boxes as we did last year, we were able to donate 65 boxes for children who might not otherwise receive any kind of gift. Wouldn't it be fun to watch a group of children open their boxes? That would certainly be the WOW in their lives.

Dining for Women will resume their meeting time after the first of the year. We will meet on January 12th at Noon if the weather cooperates. The meal and discussion are always something to look forward to. Since our inception over five years ago, we have donated nearly \$5400. We feel blessed that we do not have to face the challenges that many girls and women are confronted with, and that our donations can help impact the lives of so many.


Education Notes
